Kids Against Plastic win Rotary Young Citizen Award

Carlton Rotary nominated sisters Amy and Ella Meek for a national Rotary Young Citizen Award. They were successful and received this at Volunteer Expo in Birmingham in May. Martyn and I were proud to

The sisters from Redhill are exceptional girls with a passion for helping the environment - long before this became a
