#### **Shoeboxes for Eastern Europe**

The Rotary Shoebox Scheme is a registered charity, run by Rotary volunteers in the Oldham area. Started over 25 years ago, the operation has delivered over 1 million boxes to recipients in Eastern

Europe. The boxes are distributed throughout the year, and so far this year over 30,000 have been sent in 3 shipments to Moldova and Romania.

"Spread a little Happiness"

#### "Empowering Girls" Initiative

This initiative was started last year when Rotary districts globally were encouraged to develop projects to "empower girls".

District Governor Martyn set up a project with Past District Governor Val Leivers of Sherwood Sunrisers Rotary who he knew visited Secunderabad in India on a regular basis. Over the years Val has taught and fundraised for the Sri Sai Vidyarthi School as well as other projects in this poor area of the country. Martyn and Val initiated a scheme to enable girls in their last 3 years in the school to take part in a



tailoring course which would include the purchase of a sewing machine to then become their own at the end of their school journey. The project got off to a great start last year and so far over 30 girls have been sponsored and two qualified tailoring teachers contracted.

The students are receiving a good academic education alongside a vocational education which provides them with valuable employment skills for the future.

Funds are still needed to sponsor girls who are waiting to be included on the course and the project continues during this current Rotary year.

Carlton Rotary has been pleased to sponsor Annie. Just £300 has supplied her with a sewing machine and covers lessons in tailoring during her last 3 years at school.
