### **Eco-Greenhouse for Stanhope Primary School**

November wasn't the best month of the year for this project—but we were lucky with two fine mornings to clear 4 raised beds which were unsafe with rotting timber supports, replace them with 4 smaller beds and create a level area to site the eco-greenhouse.

The children had collected 1,300 2-litre bottles, and cut the bottoms off in preparation. We were grateful to Nexus Fostering for sponsoring the purchase of the greenhouse frame and for their employee, Megan, for helping with the build. We were also grateful to UK Timber of Corby for discount on the timber for the raised beds, D Fearn and Son for discount on gravel for the base and Hilltop Nursery for a donation of a bag of ornamental bark.



Eight club members plus three volunteers from the school worked over the two days to complete the project, with an official "hand-over" planned for January.



Instead of filling Rotary shoeboxes this year, members filled a dozen large toy boxes which were shipped along with hundreds of others






from our Rotary District direct to Rotary partners in Ukraine.
