Defibrillator and Bleed Kit project update

Our second Defibrillator and Bleed Kit installation was handed over on 30th April to the Carlton branch of Lindleys Autocentres. A partnership between **Carlton Rotary**, **Lindleys Autocentres** and



1Tec Auto Hub.

Over 30,000 people suffer an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest in the UK each year. When a defibrillator is used within the first 3–5 minutes, survival rates can increase from 6% to over 70%.

A Bleed control kit can be vital in serious accidents, helping prevent fatal blood loss before emergency services arrive.

Having accessible defibs & bleed

kits in local communities can literally be the difference between life and death.

This new defibrillator/bleed kit is available for emergency use 24/7, helping protect everyone in and around the Carlton area

A third installation site for our next defibrillator is awaited.
