Joint Presidents for 2025-26 Rotary Year



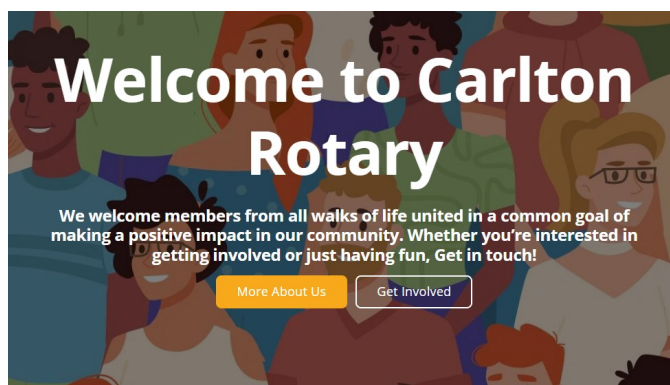
David and Tony are pleased to present their programme for the first three months of 2026, with a few visits to places of interest, along with some speaker meetings at Mapperley Golf Club.

Carlton Rotary Santa Activity

Where do our donations go? The answer is, we consider requests from our local community and also support international Rotary projects. The **books** we collected last year have now arrived in Nigeria and were presented to the newly renovated, solar-powered e-library at Edjeba College, Warri by the **Rotary Club of Edjeba**.



This project is boosting education and literacy for local students — and we're delighted to play a small part in it. Thank you to everyone who helped collect, pack and ship the books.

Locally, over the last 3 months we have given grants to the Carlton Life Saving club for new equipment and St John the Baptist Primary School, Colwick, for new dictionaries. These came in time for Christmas and were

presented by Carlton's Santa (aka President David) on their last day of term.

Santa said: "It was just so great to see about 130 excited smiling faces, when I appeared ringing the school bell, to start their day off, their enthusiasm and applause was amazing."

Other donations were made to a youth club for a trip 10-pin bowling; to the Rotary Toy Box scheme for presents for children in refuges; Christmas vouchers donated via schools and partners at Phenomenal Futures and St George's Centre for families in need; and we answered an appeal by Rotary International to contribute to the Melissa Hurricane relief fund.

Centre Manager, Tina Simpson, will be making sure the packs go to families who'll really benefit.

The children had researched and nominated local families in the Arnold area who they felt would most benefit from receiving an ECO Pack – a fantastic example of thoughtfulness and community awareness.
